Aimed at children aged 8-13 years, the academy is ideal for those who have some experience of coding, but this necessary, as all instructions and information will be provided. The session is designed to introduce them to automation, help them to understand what it is and give them a chance to use what they have learnt to build a software robot to help Marty the Martian to escape from two planets.

The event will be hosted on Zoom. Participants will be sent a unique link a few days before the event in order to take part. Participants will be able to interact with the hosts but not other participants.

After taking part in the academy all the children will be sent instructions on how to complete the Marty the Martian game and a certificate in recognition of their participation and learning.
